PROJECT DESCRIPTION & SCOPE

To reconstruct the Washington Street Interchange on the Interstate 215 (I-215), in the City of Colton. The reconstruction of the Washington Street Interchange has been split off from the Bi-County Corridor Improvement project. The project includes reconstruction of the interchange ramps and the overcrossing roadway.

NEED & PURPOSE OF PROJECT

The purpose of this project is to reconstruct and improve the interchange and to attain a desirable level of service (LOS) in the future. The Washington Street interchange is a key access point to commercial and residential areas in the City of Colton. The north bound off-ramp peak volume increase is 138% from year 2004 to 2040. The south bound on-ramp peak volume increase is 69% from year 2004 to 2040.
