Public Railroad Crossing Overhead Structure Agreement dated July 12, 2011  
Federal Wage Requirement

Full compensation for drilling and bonding of bar reinforcement or abutment tie rods shall be considered as included in the contract price paid per cubic yard for structural concrete, approach slab (Type R), and no separate payment will be made therefor.

Full compensation for constructing, testing, and removing trial slabs shall be considered as included in the contract price paid per cubic yard for structural concrete, approach slab (Type R), and no separate payment will be made therefor.

#### **10-1.74 PAVING NOTCH EXTENSION**

This work shall consist of extending existing paving notches in conformance with the details shown on the plans and these special provisions.

Concrete for the paving notch extensions shall conform to the provisions for structure approach slab concrete of these special provisions.

At least 12 hours shall elapse between the time of placing concrete for the paving notch extension and placing concrete for the structure approach slab.

The construction joint between the paving notch extension and the existing abutment shall conform to the provisions for horizontal construction joints in Section 51-1.13, "Bonding," of the Standard Specifications. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is union or non-union.

#### Union Identifiers

An identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" denotes that the union classification and rate have found to be prevailing for that

classification. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2011. The first four letters , PLUM, indicate the international union and the four-digit number, 0198, that follows indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable , i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2011, following these characters is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate/collective bargaining agreement which would be July 1, 2011 in the above example.

Union prevailing wage rates will be updated to reflect any changes in the collective bargaining agreements governing the rate.

#### Non-Union Identifiers

Classifications listed under an "SU" identifier were derived from survey data by computing average rates and are not union rates; however, the data used in computing these rates may include both union and non-union data. Example: SULA2004-007 5/13/2010. SU indicates the rates are not union rates, LA indicates the State of Louisiana; 2004 is the year of the survey; and 007 is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. A 1993 or later date, 5/13/2010, indicates the classifications and rates under that identifier were issued as a General Wage Determination on that date.

Survey wage rates will remain in effect and will not change until a new survey is conducted.

Q2. Will Cross Sections be made available for this project?

- Q3. Special Provisions Page 451, Section 10-1.05, Temporary Active Treatment System – the referenced Information Package (which provides estimated groundwater seepage rates and information on the POTW facility) is not in the Special Provisions. Please provide.
- A3. *Non-Stormwater information Package was not provided. These paragraphs are deleted.***
- Q4. Bid Item #15, “Temporary Hydraulic Mulch” – 445,000 SY. The quantity seems high. Please confirm that the quantity unit is not supposed to be in square feet.
- A4. *As stated on sheet WPCQ-1, the amount is three times the total disturbed area. The amount was tripled as the temporary mulch may need to be applied more than once at the same location throughout the project due to the various stages of work.***
- Q5. Cherry Avenue Drainage Report – 5.0 Water Quality. It is stated that a 401 Certificate, 404 Permit and 1602 Stream Bed Alteration are all needed. Who is responsible to acquire these?
- A5. *401, 404 and 1602 permits are NOT needed. This statement should be deleted.***
- Q6. IFB Page 90, D. UDBE Bid Submission Requirements, states that the Local Agency Bidder UDBE Commitment (Exhibit 15-G1) must be submitted with the bid. This form is typically submitted after the bid because it requires copies of the UDBE’s quotes, the bid item numbers associated with the work to be performed, UDBE certification number and other information that is difficult to obtain from the UDBE before the bid runner leaves the prime contractors office. In order to allow the prime contractor to consider all UDBE’s that submit quotes, can this form be submitted with the other UDBE and DBE forms four (4) business days after the bid submittal?
- A6. *The requirement will remain as stated in the IFB.***
- Q7. IFB Page 102, Instruction for Bidder’s List of Subcontractors, Exhibit 12-G, does not state when it is due. Is this form due with the bid submittal or with the other UDBE and DBE forms four (4) business days after the bid submittal?
- A7. *See Page 90, Item D2-C. Exhibit 12-G is required 4 days following the bid.***
- Q8. For drainage system 31, lines p, r and t are 24” RCP on drawing DP-18; however lines p, r and t are 30” RCP on drawing D-7. Please clarify.
- A8. *They are all 24” RCP***
- Q9. Is the drainage system 30 shown above the drainage system 31 on drawing DP-17? The profile does not have identification.
- A9. *Yes, it is System 30.***

- Q10. On drawing D-6, lines b, d and f of DS-30 are 24" RCP; however lines b, d and f on DP-17 are 36", 30" and 30" RCP. Please clarify.
- A10. *The profile is correct. The pipe sizes should be 36", 30", and 30" for b, d, and f, respectively.***
- Q11. Are the primary general liability and excess liability limits \$25 million? (not \$25,000)
- A11. *Yes, the limit should be \$25 Million. See revised language in the IFB.***
- Q12. Can the \$25M be comprised of the standard Caltrans specifications limits (i.e. primary \$2M, excess liability policies totally \$23M or more?)
- A12. *The requirement will remain as stated in the IFB.***
- Q13. Under the Railroad Protective Policy the requirement states that the Authority, the state of CA, City of Colton, City of San Bernardino and UPRR should be Named Insureds. On a Railroad Protective, only the UPRR can be the Named Insured and everyone else can be included as an Additional Insured. Please clarify.
- A13. *The requirement will be revised to state the State of California, SANBAG, and the City of Fontana should be named as additional insured. UPRR will be the Named Insured. See revised language in IFB.***
- Q14. With regards to the builder's risk requirement that says the amount of coverage should be equal to the contract amount and include coverage for quake and flood, is the request to have full builder's risk, full quake and full flood plus another 20% in soft costs covered under the All Risk policy including flood and quake? In the available insurance market - this is a very significant insurance premium and the deductibles will also be relatively high. Is the Owner willing to consider an alternative to this requirement?
- A14. *The requirement will remain as stated in the IFB.***
- Q15. Contract Time. Special Provisions P. 367 states that Contract Time is 520 WD. Bid Item # 2 "Time Related Overhead" is for 600 WD. Please clarify.
- A15. *Number of working days are 470. See Addendum No. 2 revised specifications and bid schedule.***
- Q16. Landscaping. Please see Sheet L.D. 6, 7. Does the Burgundy Gravel extend under the bridge on the south side of I-10?
- A16. *No. The burgundy gravel does not extend under the bridge.***
- Q17. Sheet DQ-17 does not show the breakdown for the 18" Slotted Plastic Pipe just a total of 673.31f.

**A17. See Addendum No. 2 attached revised quantities and bid schedule.**

Q18. We would like to respectfully request an extension of the bid date, at least one week, for the I-10/Citrus Avenue Reconstruction bid. This is a large project and will take a significant amount of time to estimate. There is also a large LA County Metro bridge bidding on August 14 at the same time.

**A18. Bid Date has been extended to August 28, 2012 at 2:00. See Addendum No. 1.**

Q19. Soundwall 697. Sheet # 389, Typical Section shows the sound wall as being on the R/W line. The Layout sheets (L-8) do not indicate a TCE on the adjacent properties. Currently there is fencing on this R/W line, securing the rear of these properties. Is there temporary fencing required inside these properties, if the existing R/W fence is removed in order to construct the new Soundwall?

**A19. The soundwall is to be constructed within the State Right of Way without removal of the existing fence.**

Q20. Special Provisions 10-1.75 states that Contractor shall complete soundwall construction within 90 days from the beginning of Clearing and Grubbing. Sound Wall 697, between Sta 15+00 and Sta 26+00 is immediately adjacent to and above the new I-10 Channel. Sheet DD-15 would suggest that the Soundwall is in fact immediately above the north wall of the new I-10 Channel. This would suggest that a) the Soundwall be placed either after the I-10 channel is installed, or b) the I-10 Channel be moved south to avoid this conflict (enough distance to install shoring for the 20'+/- deep channel excavation). If option (a) is selected, the contractor suggests that the 90 day milestone be relaxed. Please clarify.



2 (d) \$5,000,000 umbrella or excess liability. Combined total Commercial General Liability and Excess Liability limits of \$25,000,000 will be required for projects with a contract value in excess of \$25,000,000.

(e) Umbrella or excess policy shall follow form over the CONTRACTOR's General Liability coverage and shall provide a separate aggregate limit for products and completed operations coverage. The umbrella or excess policy shall contain a clause stating that it takes effect (drops down) in the event the primary limits are impaired or exhausted.

15.3 AUTHORITY, the State of California, the County of San Bernardino, the City of Fontana shall be named as additional insureds with respect to liability arising out of or connected with work or operations performed by or on behalf of the CONTRACTOR under this Contract. Coverage for such additional insureds shall not extend to liability:

(a) Arising from any defective or substandard condition of the Roadway which existed at or prior to the time the CONTRACTOR commenced work, unless such condition has been changed by the work or scope of the work requires the CONTRACTOR to maintain existing Roadway facilities and the claim arises from the CONTRACTOR' failure to maintain; or

(b) For claims occurring after the work is completed and accepted unless these claims are directly related to alleged acts or omissions of the CONTRACTOR which occurred during the course of the work; or

(c) To the extent prohibited by Section 11580.04 of the Insurance Code.

15.3.1 The policy shall stipulate that the insurance afforded the additional insureds shall apply as primary insurance. Any other insurance or self-insurance maintained by AUTHORITY will be excess only and shall not be called upon to contribute with this insurance. Such additional insured coverage shall be provided by a policy provision or by an endorsement providing coverage at least as broad as Additional Insured (Form B) endorsement form CG 2010 07 04 and CG 20 37 07 04, as published by the Insurance Services Office (ISO).

15.4 Automotive Liability Insurance – CONTRACTOR shall carry automobile liability insurance, including coverage for all owned hired and non-owned automobiles. The primary limits of liability shall not be less than \$5,000,000 combined single limit each accident for bodily injury and property damage. Umbrella or excess liability coverage used to meet the limits required under "Liability Limits/Additional Insureds," shall also apply to automobile liability.

The policy must contain the following endorsements, which must be stated on the certificate of insurance:

(a) Designated Insured Endorsement ISO form CA 20 48 02 99 (or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage) in favor of AUTHORITY, their authorized officers, employees, agents, and volunteers.

(b) Coverage for Certain Operations in Connection with Railroads ISO form CA 20 70 10 01 (or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage) showing "Union Pacific Railroad Company Property" as the designated job site.

(c) Motor Carrier Act Endorsement-Hazardous materials clean up (MCS-90) if required by law.

15.5 Railroad Protective Liability Insurance – CONTRACTOR shall carry Railroad Protective Liability Insurance written on ISO occurrence form CG 00 35 12 04 (or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage) naming UPRR as a Named Insured and the AUTHORITY, the State of California, and the City of Fontana as additional insured, covering all operations by or on behalf of CONTRACTOR providing insurance for bodily injury liability, and property damage liability. The limits of liability shall not be less than \$5,000,000 per occurrence and aggregate of \$10,000,000. A binder stating the policy is in place must be submitted to AUTHORITY and UPRR before the work may be commenced and until the original policy is forwarded to AUTHORITY.

15.6 Builder's Risk Insurance – CONTRACTOR shall purchase and maintain, in a company or companies lawfully authorized to do business in the jurisdiction in which the Project is located, property insurance written on a builder's risk "Special Form Cause of Loss" or equivalent policy form in an amount equal to the not to exceed amount of the Contract, plus the cost of materials supplied or installed by others on a full replacement cost basis. The Builder's Risk policy shall include a soft cost endorsement that covers AUTHORITY's soft costs equal to twenty percent (20%) of the contracts full value. Soft costs are defined as certain expenses, in addition to labor and materials, required to complete the project that has been delayed due to unexpected physical damage and include, but are not limited to the following; legal/accounting fees, design or other professional fees, financing costs, taxes, general administration, lease expenses, permit fees and insurance premiums. This insurance shall include interests of AUTHORITY, CONTRACTOR and its sub-contractors in the Project as insureds as their interest may appear. The insurance shall cover without limitation, loss or damage to the work arising from the perils covered under "Special Form Cause of Loss" form coverage including, without duplication of coverage for theft, fire, lightning, explosion, or hail, smoke aircraft or vehicles, riot or civil commotion, vandalism, malicious mischief, collapse, earthquake, flood, windstorm, false-work, testing and delay of startup, temporary buildings, property in transit and while stored at a temporary location, debris removal including demolition occasioned by enforcement of any applicable legal requirements, and shall cover reasonable compensation for CONTRACTOR's services and expenses required as a result of such loss. During the Project construction period, the AUTHORITY, CONTRACTOR and its sub-contractors shall mutually waive all rights of recovery for damages caused by fire or other perils covered by the Builders Risk "Special Form Cause of Loss" insurance. All applicable policies of insurance covering the work or the property of the CONTRACTOR or sub-contractor shall be endorsed to provide a waiver of subrogation in favor of the AUTHORITY, CONTRACTOR and sub-contractors-as their interest may appear.

Attention is directed to the provisions in Section 8-1.03, "Beginning of Work" in Section 8-1.06 "Time of Completion," and in Section 8-1.07, "Liquidated Damages," of the Standard Specifications and these special provisions.

Within 10 calendar days of Award, the Contractor must submit acceptable payment and performance bonds and complete all insurance requirements stipulated in, the Invitation For Bids and Contract. It is anticipated that a Notice to Proceed will be issued within 20 days of the contract award pending receipt of bonds and insurances. Begin work within 55 calendar days after award of the contract by the Department. The plant establishment period shall be Type 2 and shall not be less than 250 working days.

2 The Contractor will have **470 WORKING DAYS**, beginning 55 calendar days after award of the contract by the Department, to complete all the necessary work.

A calendar day is defined as every day of the week, including Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays and inclement weather days or conditions resulting immediately there from shall be considered to be calendar days.

Although it is difficult to calculate the actual damages, Department has estimated the damages resulting from the work not being completed within the stipulated number of calendar days to be as provided below. The Contractor shall pay to Department the sum of \$ 10,500 PER CALENDAR DAY, for each and every calendar day's delay in finishing the work in excess of



The engineer's construction cost estimate was \$49.6 million. With supplemental items, agency furnished items, and contingency, the total project was estimated at \$55.4 million.

Bids were opened on August 28, 2012. San Bernardino Associated Governments (SANBAG) received two (2) bids from prime contractors (Exhibit A). At the bid opening Ortiz Enterprises, Inc. was identified as the lowest bidder at \$49,190,134.21 followed by Steve P. Rados, Inc.

Ortiz Enterprises, Inc. bid documents were complete and in order in accordance with the IFB requirements. Based on documentation provided on bid day Ortiz did not meet the Underutilized Disadvantage Business Enterprise (UDBE) goal of 7.17%. Ortiz documented only a 4.4% UDBE participation. Per the bid requirements within 4 business days after bid date bidders are required to provide Good Faith Efforts (GFE) documentation of their UDBE outreach. Both SANBAG staff and our on-call Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) compliance consultant reviewed Ortiz GFE documented efforts in reaching out to UDBE firms to participate in the project. Based on this review it was concluded that Ortiz's GFE's were adequate as defined by 49 CFR Part 26, Appendix A and the IFB requirements Staff recommends Ortiz Enterprises, Inc. be deemed the lowest responsive, responsible bidder and the construction Contract No. C12224 for the I-10/Cherry Avenue Interchange Project be awarded to Ortiz Enterprises, Inc. in the amount of \$49,190,134.21.

Staff is also recommending approval of Allowances/Contingency for Contract No. C12224 on the I-10/Cherry Avenue Interchange Project consisting of supplemental items, agency furnished materials, and contingency for a total amount of \$5,282,315.79 (See Exhibit B).

With the addition of Allowances/Contingency the total construction cost is \$54,472,450.00. This low bid amount is approximately \$500,000 or 1 % under the Engineer's Estimate for the total cost of the project.


